Aggie Ebrahimi Bazaz has an M.A. in Multicultural Literature & Women's Studies from the University of Georgia and an M.F.A. in Film & Media Arts from Temple University. She has written and directed three documentary films exploring issues concerning the Iranian diaspora. *Inheritance* (2012) is a first-person documentary film that investigates diasporic identity formation in the shadow of Iranian gender politics and the Islamic Revolution. Honest and vulnerable, *Inheritance* tells an

immigration story we don't often see, one in which crossing over is not an entrée into what's to come, but simply a different backdrop against which to relive what was. It received the Loni Ding Award for Social Issue Documentary at CAAMFest (formerly the San Francisco International Asian American Film Festival).

The director will discuss the making of her film after the screening.
