Residency Requirement in the major: Com Lit 190 and four additional upper-division courses in Comparative Literature or other courses offered in the School of Humanities must be completed successfully at UCI. By petition, two of the four may be taken through the UC Education Abroad Program, providing course content is approved by the appropriate program advisor or chair.

NOTE: All Comparative Literature courses require completion of the lower-division writing requirement as a prerequisite. 	<p>OPTION 1: Two upper-division courses in a foreign literature or culture in which texts are read in the original <i>All courses that satisfy this requirement include literature read in the original language, so they require completion of at least 2C (or equivalent) as a prerequisite. All Spanish literature courses require completion of Spanish 3A and 3B (Advanced Grammar & Composition).</i></p>	Prerequisite: at least 2C in the language (or equivalent)
	<p>OPTION 2: One upper-division course in a foreign literature or culture in which texts are read in the original, plus one upper-division course in literature or culture in translation <i>Literature/culture in translation courses are entirely in English and do not require any background in the language. A partial list of approved literature in translation courses is available each quarter on the Humanities Undergraduate website, under Course Descriptions for Literature in Translation.</i></p>	No restrictions or prerequisites for literature/culture in translation courses.
	<p>OPTION 3: 2 courses in Greek 103/104 or 2 courses in Latin 103/104 <i>This option is only available to students who have completed Greek or Latin 1ABC and 100A or B. These two courses may overlap with the School of Humanities language requirement.</i></p>	Prerequisite: Greek or Latin 1ABC and 100A/B
	<p>OPTION 4: Chinese 3C or Japanese 3C or Korean 3C or Vietnamese 3C, plus one upper-division course in a foreign literature or culture in which texts are read in the original or in translation <i>This option is only available to students who have sufficient background in an East Asian language to enroll in the 3C level.</i></p>	Prerequisite: 3B or equivalent, or placement into 3C

*An Independent Study course may substitute for any part of the Departmental foreign language requirement when courses in the language or literature desired are not available.
