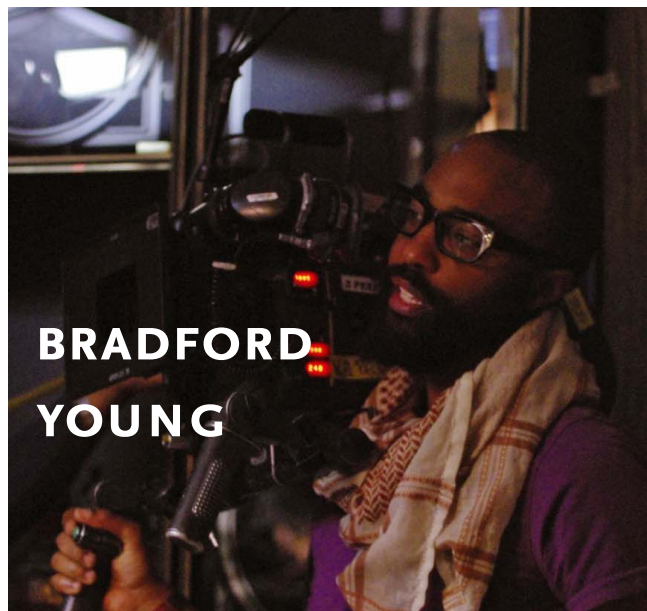
FREE ANGELA AND ALL POLITICAL PRISONERS

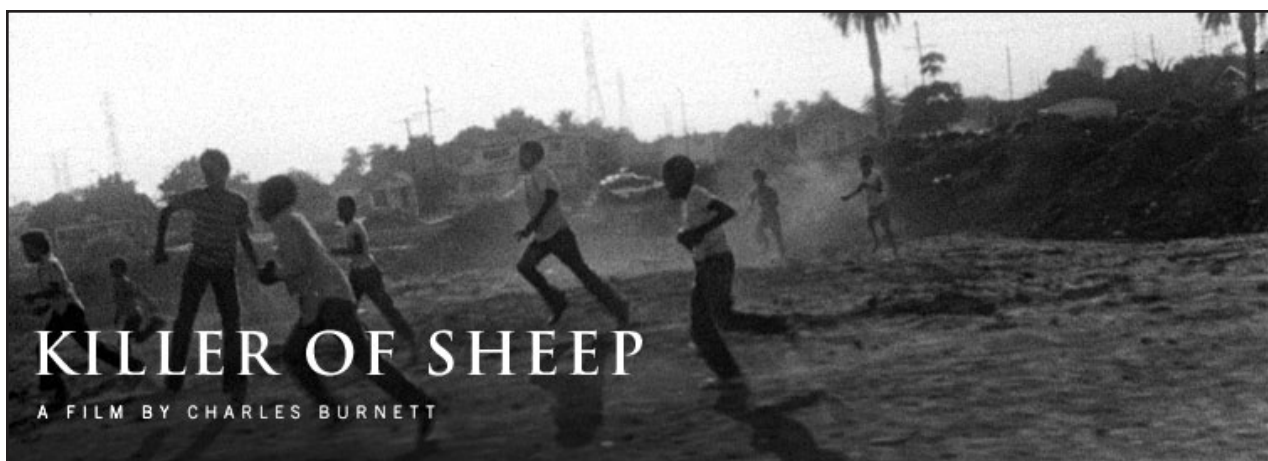
