Oshin Khachikian is a Ph.D. student in sociology at the University of California, Irvine who works with K-12 teachers, PTA parents, students and community volunteers to understand how access to community based resources helps close the achievement gap for the children of immigrants. Khachikian’s research has been published in *Ethnic and Racial Studies*, *Journal of Ethnic and Migration Studies*, *The Russell Sage Foundation Journal of the Social Sciences* (co-authored), and *The Society Pages* (co-authored). He holds a B.A. in global studies (magna cum laude) from UCLA and a M.A. in social science from University of Chicago.
