The Mongol rulers of China's Yuan dynasty (1271-1368) enshrined woven images of their deceased ancestors in the imperial portrait halls. The woven medium of these images was a dramatic departure from the established traditions of imperial portraiture in East Asia, where such images were previously painted or sculpted. What accounted for this transition? This lecture considers this question from the perspective of the Mongol ruling house at the center of a world empire.
