"Oyarzún's Tenses" Jacques Lezra UC Riverside Pablo Oyarzún is Professor of Philosophy and Aesthetics at the University of Chile. He is the author of over 400 books, essays, and book chapters on Epicurus, Pseudo-Longinus, Swift, Kant, Baudelaire, Kleist, Benjamin, and Celan. He has lectured widely in Venezuela, Argentina, Colombia, Holland, and the United States.

Jacques Lezra is Professor and Chair of Hispanic Studies at UC Riverside. He is a scholar of comparative as well as Spanish-language literature and focuses his research in the fields of philosophy; the literature and visual culture of Spain and Europe in the early modern period; Marx and Marxism; and the theory, philosophy and practices of translation.
