Enroll for Winter 2020 EAS 55 Horror and Japanese Religions



There is a fine line between the sacred and the horrific or profane. Both are taboo; both may provide powerful experiences; both are often to be approached or exposed to with care, caution, and permission. Religion and horror are closely bound: what is awesome may also be awful.

This course teaches the narratives of fear according to different religious cultures (here, primarily Japanese) so that the student may recognize and, perhaps, disarm them. We will look not only at the motifs and stores that horrify, but the "structure" of fear, and the ways in which fascination, repulsion, and terror are evoked through a series of recent films (including The Ring [Ringu], Dark Water [Honogurai Mizu no soko kara], The Inerasable [Zan'e], and Suicide Club [Jisatsu Sākuru]).
