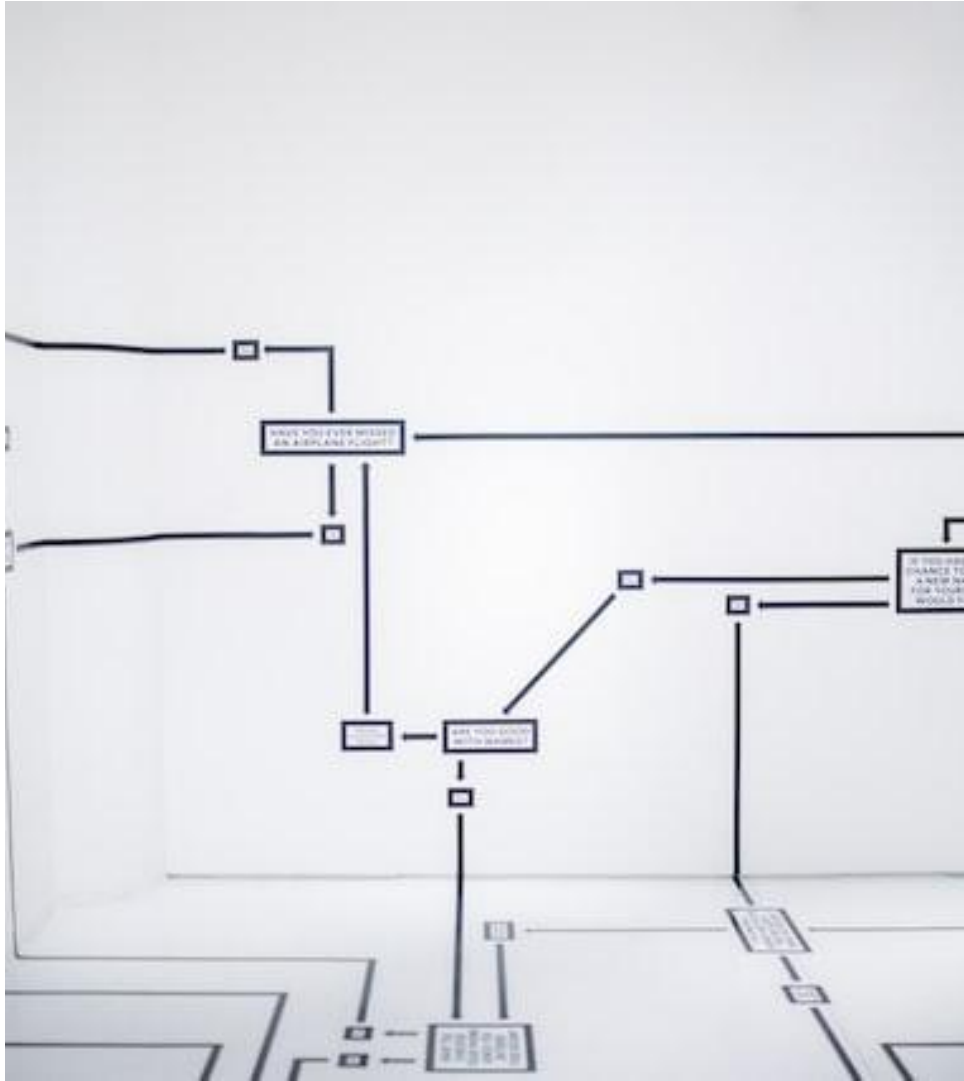

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PROJECT:
an individual or
collaborative enterprise that
is carefully planned to
achieve a particular aim

Projects can be any size

- A class paper
- A dissertation
 - A camping trip
 - A job search
 - A museum exhibit
 - A book
 - A grant proposal
 - A handmade gift



What are the **COMPONENTS** of a **PROJECT?**

Goals vs. Objectives

Goal: what is the purpose of this project, what will change because it is successful?

Objectives: what are the deliverables of this project, what tangibles will it produce, are there deliverables that need to be produced along the way?

Example: your objective in graduate school is to complete a dissertation and get a PhD.

What is YOUR goal? What is your purpose for getting a PhD? What will change once you have a PhD?

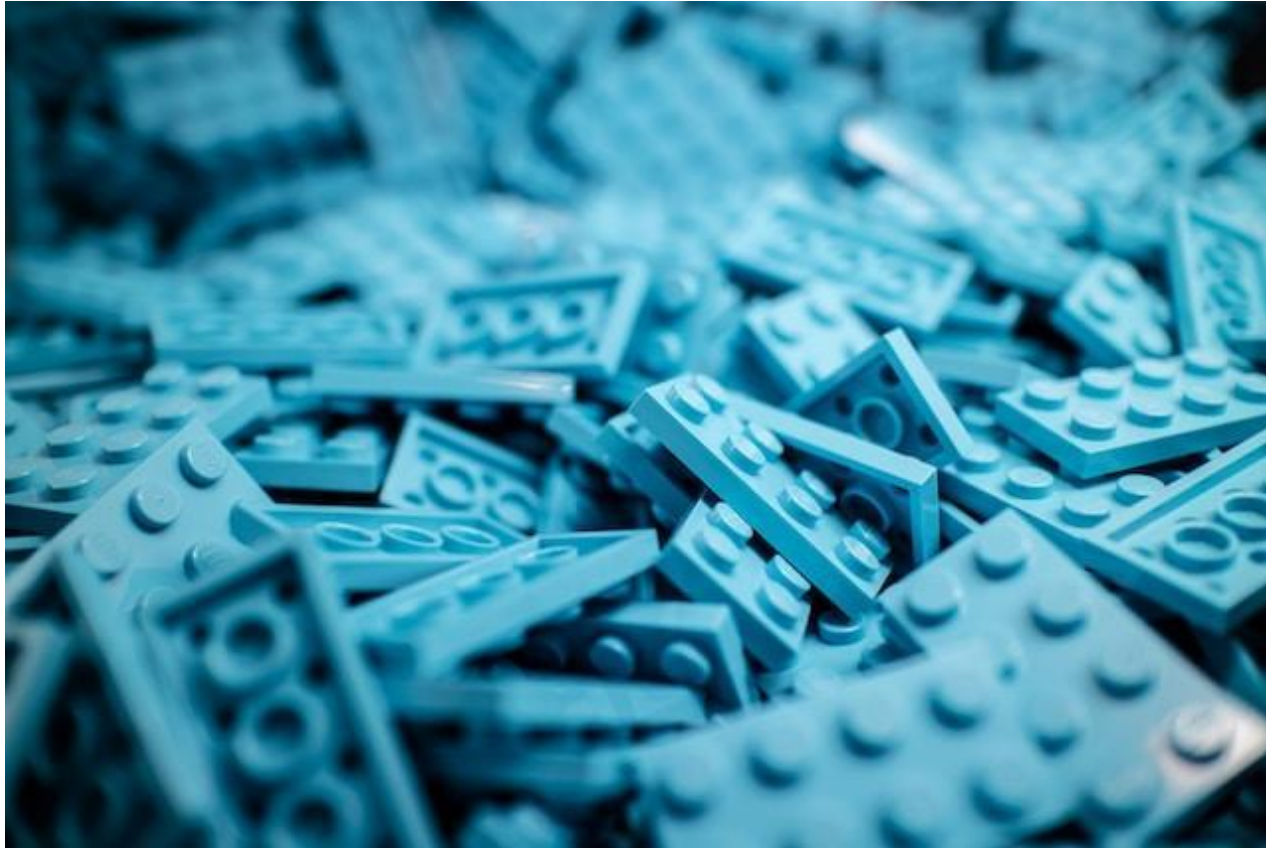


PLAN:

Resources

- People – team members, advisors
- Money – cash, in-kind, institutional, grants
- Time – your time, other people's availability
- Materials & Supplies
- Training – for you and team members
- Space
- Equipment

Other Project Components



- Timeline and Due Dates
- Constraints (personal and organizational)
- What is not included in the project
- Reporting lines and requirements

Put it all together into a

PROJECT
SCOPE



WHY?

If you haven't thought through...

- The main goal and what isn't included... it's easy to get distracted by tasks that are peripheral to your project (*scope creep*).
- All the possible costs... you won't know how much money you actually need.
- Any specialized components... you might not have the necessary skills or the right people at the right time.
- Personal constraints, such as ability to travel due to family commitments... you might not be able to meet the initial timeline.

Example: they built a museum but didn't make sure there was money to open it

HOW TO PLAN A PROJECT

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So many resources!

- Books, of course.
- Examples of grant applications (but remember, a grant application may not include all components of the full project).
- Templates online – projects vs. “project management” vs Project Management
- Digital tools (free versions) – Asana, ClickUp, Trello, Wrike
- Your system that already works for you
