FOR SUMMER SESSION 2024, WE ARE OFFERING A **FULL-TIME FEE INCENTIVE PROGRAM** FOR ALL CURRENT AND INCOMING UC STUDENTS.

STUDENTS WILL NEED TO PAY FOR UP TO ONLY 8 UNITS IN PER UNIT COURSE FEES. FOR EXAMPLE, A CURRENT UCI UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT ENROLLING ON TIME IN 12 UNITS OF COURSEWORK WILL PAY \$2,232 IN COURSE FEES (\$279/UNIT X 8 UNITS), A \$185 CAMPUS FEE, PLUS ANY APPLICABLE COURSE MATERIALS FEES.



SUMMER SESSION I



PHILOS 1 INTRODUCTION TO PHILOSOPHY

A selection of philosophical problems, concepts, and methods, e.g., free will, cause and substance, personal identity, the nature of philosophy itself. Materials fee. (online) (IV)*

PHILOS 2 PUZZLES AND PARADOXES

Introduction to the formal tools needed to comprehend and evaluate philosophical arguments and theoretical reasoning in general. (online) (IV and VB)

PHILOS 3 TECHNOLOGY AND SOCIETY

A study of the nature of technology, its relation to human values, the philosophical assumptions in its development, and the philosophical implications of technology. (online) (II)

PHILOS 4 INTRODUCTION TO ETHICS

Selected topics from the history of ethics, e.g., the nature of the good life and the moral justification of conduct. (online) (IV)

PHILOS 5 CONTEMPORARY MORAL PROBLEMS

Selected moral issues of current interest, e.g., abortion, sexual morality, euthanasia, capital punishment, reverse discrimination, civil disobedience, or violence. (online) (IV)

PHILOS 102W INTRODUCTION TO THE THEORY OF KNOWLEDGE

A study of one or more of the basic issues in epistemology, e.g., the role of perception in the acquisition of knowledge, the nature of evidence, the distinction between belief and knowledge, and the nature of truth and certainty.

Prerequisite: Satisfactory completion of the Lower-Division Writing requirement.

Overlaps with PHILOS 102, LPS 102. (online) (Ib)

PHILOS 131C MEDICAL ETHICS

Analysis of moral issues concerning health care. Topics may include just allocation of scarce medical resources, the doctor/patient relationship, genetic engineering, surrogate motherhood, abortion, euthanasia, or social policy concerning AIDS. (on campus)

MED HUM 1 HEALTH, WELLNESS, AND CONCEPTION OF THE BODY

Asks what is health and who gets to have it? What is considered a “healthy” or “sick” body? We analyze historical and contemporary experiences of illness, medicine, and caregiving, including how patients represent their bodies and healing. (on campus) (III or IV)
