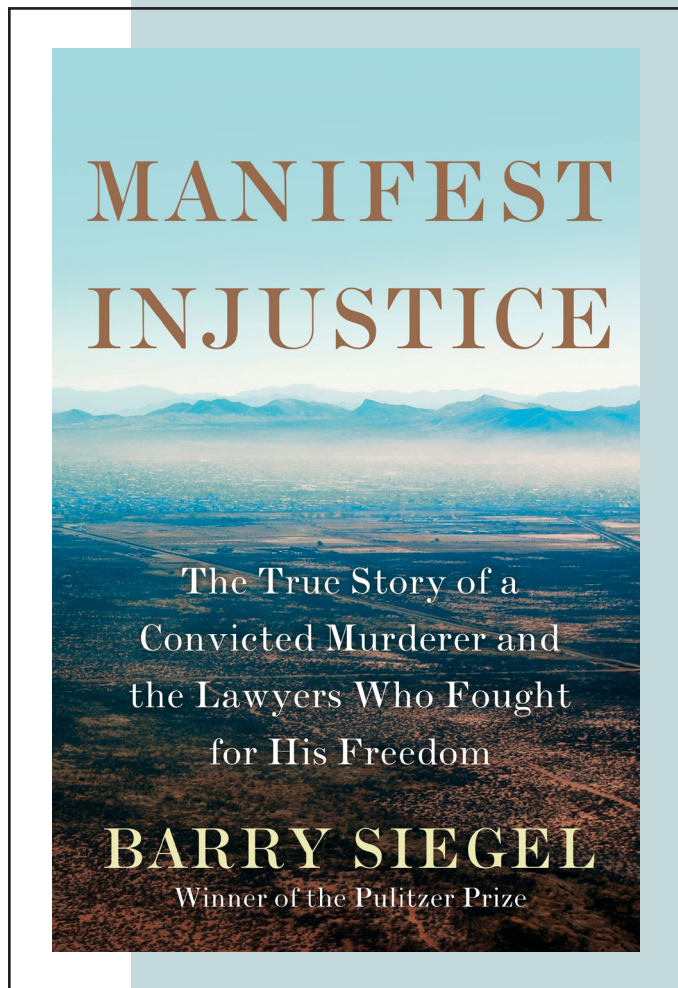

**BARRY SIEGEL** is a Pulitzer Prize winning former national correspondent for the *Los Angeles Times* and the author of seven books, including four volumes of narrative nonfiction and three novels set in imaginary Chumash County on the central coast of California. Siegel earned a bachelor's degree in English literature from Pomona College. After considering film school, he enrolled at the Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism, where he earned a master's degree. He began at the *Los Angeles Times* in 1976 as a staff writer in the features section and in 1980 became a roving national correspondent, pursuing a self-created assignment that involved no fixed beat, no relation to breaking news, and no time or space constraints. In 2003, Siegel left the *Los Angeles Times* to join the English department and become the founding director of the literary journalism program at UC Irvine.
