# UCI School of Humanities STUDY ABROAD TIPS

FOR HUMANITIES MAJORS

### MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

EAP courses applied to major requirements should match UCI courses in the following ways:

- <u>Content/Theme:</u> EAP courses do not need to be an exact match for UCI courses however they should meet the basic content of the course you are attempting to replace.
- <u>Units</u>: EAP courses should be at least the same number of units as the UCI courses you are attempting to replace. EAP courses can be combined to meet the minimum number of required units
- <u>Course level:</u> Lower division courses (any course at UCI numbered 1-99) may not be used for upper division requirements. Upper division courses (any course at UCI numbered 100-199) may not be used for general education requirements.

Look for "additional courses from list" sections of your major requirements and consider using study abroad courses in those sections. Carefully check the course catalogue for major courses that must be completed at UCI.



#### WHY GO ABROAD?

As a Humanities major, a study abroad experience can uniquely benefit your academic experience without hindering your degree progress. Apply all the concepts of humanistic inquiry you're learning at UCI and explore them in a whole new context! Consider the following benefits of studying abroad:

- Explore a new culture or academic interest
- Fulfill major electives with unique and exciting courses
- Unlock career opportunities through fieldwork or internships
- Gain more independence and develop interpersonal skills

## RESIDENCY

The following Humanities majors require that at least **5** upper division courses be completed at UCI:

- African American Studies
- Asian-American Studies
- Art History
- Classics
- Chinese Studies
- East Asian Cultures
- European Studies
- Film and Media Studies
- Gender and Sexuality Studies
- Global Middle East Studies
- Japanese Language and Literature
- Korean Literature and Culture
- Philosophy
- Religious Studies

The following majors have **more specific** residency requirements:

- **Comparative Literature:** ComLit 190 and 4 additional upper division courses must be completed at UCI. Two of the four may be completed through EAP.
- **English:** English 15, English 100, English 101W, 2 English 102s, and English 106 must be completed at UCI.
- **French:** Five upper division courses must be completed at UCI, of which a maximum of three may be taught entirely in English. A maximum of four upper division courses taken during study abroad may be counted toward the major.
- **German:** Five upper division courses must be completed at UCI. Two of the five may be completed through EAP.
- **Global Cultures:** Five upper division courses must be completed at UCI. Two of the five may be completed through EAP.
- **History:** One course from the History 70s series, History 100W, History 190 and three upper division History courses must be completed at UCI. Two of the six courses may be completed through EAP.
- Literary Journalism: LJ 20, LJ 21, LJ 100, LJ 101A, and 3 LJ 101BWs must be completed at UCI.
- **Spanish:** Five upper division courses must be completed at UCI. Two of the five may be completed through EAP.

Lower and upper division writing must be completed at UCI.
